ith the continuous active support of HKPCA members and potential members, The AGM 2016 was held in great success on 24 June 2016. We were honoured to have Professor Alvin Leung Seung Ming, Dean of Education, Faculty of Education, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, one of the HKPCA founders, to be our guest speaker to share with us his precious experience in "Career Development of Professional Counsellors". A total of 123 members/potential members joined the meeting, with 96.97% attendance rate. Thank you to the Immediate Past President Dr. CHUI Yat Hung for his 4 years contributions to the Association and congratulations to the new council board with new 2016-2017 President Dr. FUNG Lai Chu Annis leading the Council to a new era. It was

adjourned with a warm dinner and social gathering after the AGM.

As the oldest and most established association representing a broad spectrum of professional counsellors in Hong Kong, we will strive to continue to raise the standard of counselling practice in Hong Kong, to strengthen the professional network, to offer ongoing training activities, to conduct researches including the publication of counselling studies to enhance ethical standards, and to advocate counselling education in Hong Kong. We also work towards promoting pubic understanding on counselling service, in the light of whole person development, wellness and mental health in Hong Kong.

Motion 1

Ratio between Post-master Supervised Practice Hours and Post-master Supervision Hours

The ratio between post-master Supervised Practice Hours and post-master Supervision Hours be at least FIVE to ONE (5 : 1), which means for every 5 practice hours, there should be at least 1 supervision hour; and that this new requirement applies to the 2017 and subsequent admission cohorts.

Combination of Two Membership Categories

With effect from January 2017, the current HKPCA membership categories of "Associate Member" and "Junior Member" will be combined into one category under the name of "Associate Member", with voting right.

Motion 3

Adjustment of Membership Fee and Certificate Fee

With effect from January 2017, the annual membership fees of Fellow, Associate Fellow, Member and Associate Member be increased by \$50 each, and that the issuance of paper certificates for all categories be increased to \$50 each.

Introduction to Animal-assisted Therapy 動物輔助治療初探

Preface:

The Story of Jingles and Johnny: The Origin of Animal-assisted Therapy

nimal-assisted therapy (AAT), Athe incorporation of the talents and positive traits of therapy animals into different therapeutic contexts, is a practice modality that is considered an additive to established interventions. The first piece of professional AAT literature can be found in a case report written by Boris Levinson, an American child psychologist, in 1962. Levinson made use of his own dog, Jingles, in the treatment of Johnny, a severely withdrawn child. At the beginning he had no plan to incorporate Jingles into the sessions with Johnny. But on one appointment day, Johnny and his mother arrived at Levinson's office several hours earlier. Jingles followed Levinson to the door. Jingles ran right up to Johnny and began to lick him. Levinson was very surprised as Johnny cuddled up to and petted Jingles. Thereafter Levinson allowed Jingles to be present in the diagnostic interview. By the end of the session, Johnny expressed his desire to come back and play with Jingles. The treatment of Johnny by Levinson and the "co-therapist" Jingles started then. Levinson described the changes in his relationship with the child during the treatment process as follows: At the beginning sessions, Johnny was seemingly not aware of the presence of Levinson while playing with Jingles; subsequently, there were many conversations between Levinson and Johnny, and the replies from Johnny were coherent though Johnny was very intent upon Jingles; eventually, Levinson was included in the play with the child and the dog. The establishment of rapport allowed Levinson to work out the problems of Johnny. As Levinson (1972) stated, it is not easy for the therapists to enter into the world of and gain trust from severely ego-disturbed children. He believed pets could be easily accepted by these children as their playmates



and could bring them into the real world. According to Carl Rogers (1963), when Levinson presented his paper "the Dog as Co-therapist" at a Convention of the American Psychological Association, "some of those who listened to the paper thought this was ridiculous poppycock, and that his idea had no place among serous therapists" (p.6). Nevertheless, Levinson's case report has brought out insights in the possibility of incorporating a dog in the healing process. His accidental discovery has aroused further interests and explorations on the therapeutic value of animals on humans, especially on children with autism. Over the last 30 years, there have been growing interests in AAT, and more and more empirical studies on it were conducted. There are at least six systematic reviews and meta-analysis studies in the last decade.
