Workshop on Marital Counseling & Emotional Focused Therapy

In this workshop, participants will be introduced to the current theories that inform therapeutic practice. The therapeutic assessment with reference to marital counselling as well as the selection of appropriate interventions will be explored.

3. To explore ways of thinking about and working with marital distress that foster hope, nurture compassion and inspire possibilities for change.

She is the first Supervisor of Family Mediation team in Hong Kong Centre for Marriage Advisory Council as well as a major trainer in Therapeutic Family Mediation. In 1997, she started Sex Therapy in the Family service field aimed to improve intimacy of couple.
