Art is an alternative medium for expression of inner thoughts and feelings; one's issues usually manifest themselves symptomatically in the art pieces. Through the creation process, catharsis of feelings, debriefing of traumatic experience, exploration of the ambivalence, gaining new insight and resolution of problems of oneself are seen.


