Purpose of the workshop:

- Effective classroom teaching, e.g., establishing classroom rules, teaching appropriate behaviors, etc.
- Strategies for managing problem behaviors.

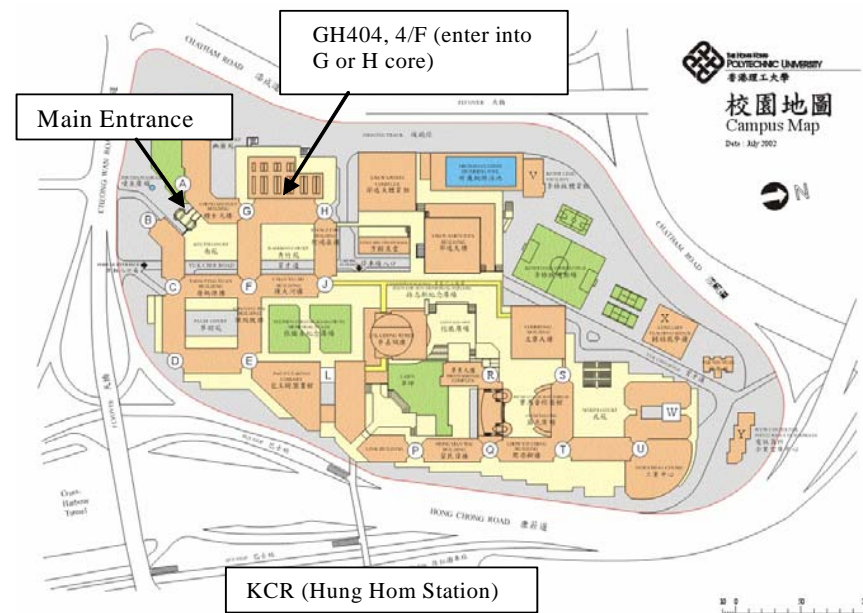

Dr. Chung received her teacher training in both general and special education and had 16 years of teaching experience in general and special schools, 6 and 10 years respectively. She then became the Principal of Pinehill Village No. 3 School for students with multiple disabilities.

Later on, she continued her education at the University of Oregon in USA and obtained a Bachelor degree in Psychology, a Master degree in Special Education and finally a PhD in Special Education, specializing in positive behavior support for students with problem behaviors in schools and other settings, and education for children and adults with disabilities.

During her studies at the university, she volunteered as a School Supervisor to supervise master's student teachers who sought a teaching license there. She also worked as a Research Assistant in its Child Development & Rehabilitation Center, where she conducted research studies, worked with a medical team and provided direct services for children with eating problems and other behavior problems and their families and/or teachers.
