

## **Workshop on Crisis Intervention in School**

This workshop provides an overview of contemporary crisis intervention approaches with emphasis on personal growth and practical issue. Through exploring the psychological impact of crisis on clients and service providers as well as grasping the basic concept of crisis intervention, participants can develop deeper understanding of different parties concerned in times of crisis. At the same time, participants can sharpen their skills in handling crisis by analyzing a variety of cases such as suicide, psychotic breakdown, physical abuse, sexual assault, substance abuse and post-traumatic stress disorder.

### **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon completion of the training, participants are expected to:

1. Understand the key concepts of crisis intervention and their implications for practice.
2. Acquire and apply the crisis intervention knowledge and skills in self-help and helping others in crisis.
3. Enhance sensitivity toward one's role as a person as well as a professional in handling crisis.
