Exploring the Key Issues in

Counselling Families with Adolescents

Parenting is a challenging task in the 21st century, and parenting adolescents even more challenging! Repeatedly we learn from the media about adolescent schizophrenia, drug addiction, web-addiction, school bullying, homosexuality, sexual abuse, suicide,....etc. Adolescents discover that they are no longer children, and that their parents could no longer "control" them like before. They are ready to explore the world. In their eagerness to fly, they become overconfident about their own abilities, and are very aversive to constraints and supervision. Parents, on the other hand, find their children exposed to different scary outside influences, but at the same time, not as amenable to their supervision and guidance as before. Suddenly they find the previous parenting methods no longer work, but feel at a loss about what to do instead. Tension in the family naturally increases quickly.

As helping professionals, we try to help by educating parents about the developmental characteristics of adolescents, by exhorting parents to spend more time with their adolescents and to demonstrate more care, and by teaching communication skills. Are such help enough? Depending on who we happen to be working with, we may feel confused and may find ourselves alternately take the side of either the parents or the adolescents, but we may not always be able to look at their struggles from both angles. This workshop aims at exploring some common issues and challenges in the relationships and dynamics between parents and their adolescent children, and relevant counseling skills will be introduced. The workshop is suitable for all professionals who work with adolescents and/or their families.
